

Progression

Learners are able to progress onto the NCFE CACHE Entry Level Certificate in Caring for a Child/Children (Entry 3) or NCFE CACHE Level 1 Award, Certificate and Diploma in Caring for Children giving the opportunity to carry forward shared units.

Further progression opportunities will depend on the learners' abilities, but could include a broad range of destinations in Foundation Learning including:

- GCSEs
- Supported employment
- Independent living.


