Courses Overview

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) is for candidates whose first language is not English and it assesses the four skills of Speaking, Writing, Reading and Listening.

The topics and tasks covered are relevant to learners and are related to everyday work, study, community and social situations.

The training on offer is from Entry Level 1 to Level 2 with an introduction to various aspects of everyday life in the UK. You will study ESOL and IT for 15 hours a week and you will have an individual teacher.

Entry Requirements:

- Aged 16+ and above
- Have the right to live and work in the UK
- Completion of Initial Assessment and Information, Advice and Guidance (IAG)

Qualification:

English Language Skills for Life and Work that improves your:

- **Speaking and Listening**
Communication at school and job interviews
- **Reading**
Reading letters, newspapers and applying for work
- **Writing**
Planning an event, CV and letter writing. Applying for work

Soft Skills and Progression

Working with others, communication, organising and planning, punctuality, employability, health and well-being planning.

Learners can also use it as a springboard into almost any other qualification or career path.



Embedded Courses

These courses are offered at level 1 and level 2 whilst studying the vocational courses subject, includes ESOL and have an individual tutor.

Vocational Course include

- Childcare
- Early Years
- Health and Social Care
- Business Administration

How long does it take?

Between 6-12 weeks depending on the level, but we will agree on a pace to suit you. Courses are offered in the day time, evening and Saturdays (depending on level and learner numbers). You will study ESOL for 3 hours in the evening and on Saturdays.

There may be fees payable for all courses depending on residency status and income.
