Here is why:

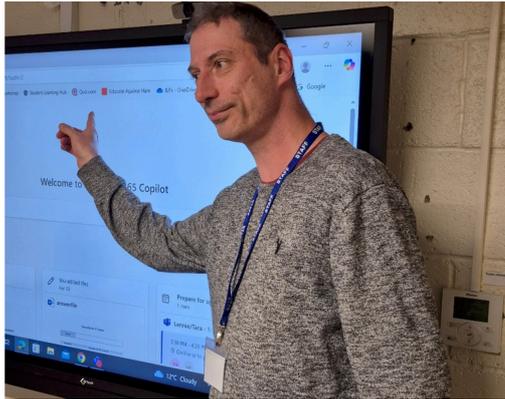

"My name is Peter Molnar and I am originally from Hungary. Back in my home country I worked as a waiter in a top restaurant and worked as a retail manager.

When I first came to the UK, I worked in hospitality roles such

My initial assessment results were working to maths at level 1 and English level 2. My application and assessment procedure went, overall, I had a positive experience at my first visit.

I began Maths Level 1 in October 2022 and English Level 2 in November. I progressed to Maths Level 2 and completed it in April 2023. Wanting to improve further, I enrolled in a non-accredited ICT course in November 2023. By November 2024, I had completed ICDL Level 2, gaining skills in Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and IT security—topics I previously knew little about. Throughout, my tutors were supportive and encouraging, helping me build confidence. Their feedback kept me motivated, and the experience helped me grow personally and socially.

I later saw an advert for a volunteer role at MI supporting ICT learners. After speaking with my tutor, I began volunteering in January 2025. I now help others

as restaurants, bars, and events. In 2017, I moved into retail, but by 2018, I left work to become a full-time dad.

When my child started school in 2022, I felt it was time to refresh my skills and prepare to return to work. That's when I discovered MI ComputSolutions, which offered not only training but also advice, guidance, and employability support—exactly what I needed after a long break.

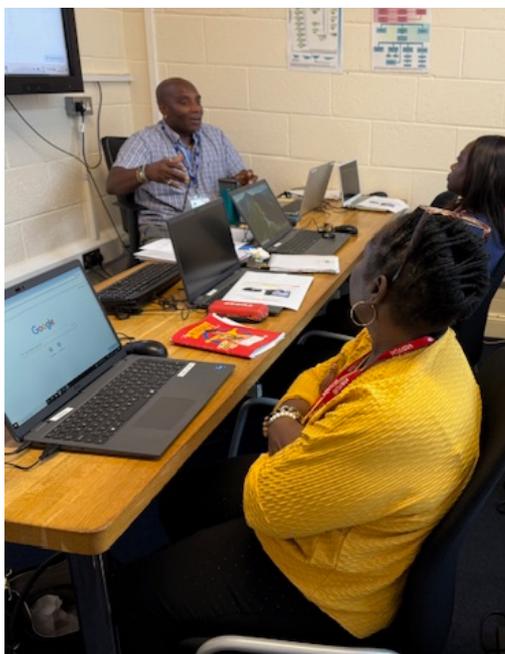

Plastic Free July

Plastic Free July is a global movement that happens annually with the intent of reducing the use of single-use plastics.

Did you know that reducing plastic is not only good for the planet, but it is also good for your wallet?

Learn how and get involved:

- **Bring a reusable bottle or cup** instead of buying bottled drinks. Switching to a reusable bottle can save you over £300 a year!

- **Prepping lunch at home** in reusable containers means less spending on takeaway meals. By doing this you can save £10–£30 per week!
- **Say no to plastic cutlery and straws**, instead keep a reusable set in your bag.
- **Use cloth bags** when shopping. Using your own shopping bags can save you 5p - 10p per bag, every time you shop.
- **Buy in bulk or refill where possible** to reduce packaging waste. Purchasing items like rice, pasta or cleaning products in bulk or at refill stations often works out cheaper per unit than smaller plastic versions. Tip: Charities like Oxfam offer some of these refillable cleaning products.
- **Store food in reusable containers** instead of cling film. Creating your own beeswax wraps at home is a great and fun alternative and the environment will thank you for it.

Remember the key is to make small changes everyday. Each step you take will make a difference to the planet, your lifestyle and your community.

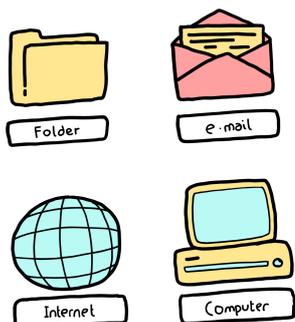

2023/24 London Learner Survey

Every Londoner deserves the opportunity to gain the skills they need to get themselves a great job and lead a healthier and happier life.

New data, published by City Hall, shows that the Mayor's investment in adult learning is transforming the lives of Londoners and supporting business to close skills gaps.

Last year alone, 77,000 Londoners secured a job, progressed at work or continued their education after taking a course. Those progressing in work saw their incomes rise by an average of 9%.

But the impact goes beyond earnings with almost all Londoners (94%) reporting improvements in their wellbeing, confidence and ability to meet new people.

In addition, more than 45,000 learners were employed in sectors vital to London's growth, including health, social care and the experience economy.
